

ILC STUDENT CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2023

Entries are now invited for the 2023 Immanuel Arts Festival to be held at Immanuel Lutheran College from 25 to 28 May 2023.

The Festival is now in its 42nd year and promotes visual, creative and performance art within the Sunshine Coast community. Entry into the Student Art category is open to all students on the Sunshine Coast, not just those from ILC. The format for the 2023 Immanuel Arts Festival will be as follows:

- An exhibition and sale of paintings, drawings, prints, sculpture, photography, wearable and creative arts will be held at Immanuel Lutheran College, A. J. Jericho Stadium, 126-142 Wisers Road, Buderim.
- The gallery will open to the general public from 9.00am to 5.00pm on Thursday 25 to Sunday 28 May 2023 (2.00pm closure on Sunday). The Opening Night and announcement of all winners will be held on Thursday 28 May from 6.30pm, however this is a licensed event and children are **unable** to attend. Parents are welcome to purchase tickets to attend. Award winners will be notified and presented with their prize at a future school assembly.
- The gallery will be open to the public from Thursday 25 to Sunday 28 May. Tickets are \$5 per adult and children are free.
- **All work must be the student artist's unaided work (please no parental tampering)**, completed within the last 12 months and must be the property of the artist.
- The mezzanine level of the gallery will be dedicated to displaying student art.
- Students are welcome to submit work as 'Not For Sale' however, if a piece is available for sale, it will incur a 10% commission to be paid to Immanuel Lutheran College.

HOW TO ENTER

- a) Read the Conditions of Entry below for Primary School (page 2) or Secondary School (page 4) Art Submissions. **Please note** this year we have changed the prizes from previous years.
- b) ILC Students are **not required** to submit an online entry prior to dropping off their artwork.
- c) Primary School students will be invited to drop off their artwork between Monday 15 and Friday 19 May. At this time, entry details will be recorded by the Arts Festival committee. See information below.
- d) Secondary School students will be invited to discuss their submission/s with Mr Elliot in Visual Art and drop their work off between Monday 15 and Friday 19 May. At this time, entry details will be recorded by Mr Elliot and Mrs Taylor. See information below.
- e) Entry to the Arts Festival is **FREE** for all Immanuel Lutheran College students.
- f) **No artwork or changes to artwork will be accepted after 10.00am on Friday 19 May 2023.**

1. PROCESS FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL ART SUBMISSIONS

- ILC Students are not required to fill out an online entry prior to submitting their artwork.
- Students can submit a maximum of **two (2) pieces** of art in any 2D form (i.e. painting, drawing or photography).
- Students can also submit **one (1) additional piece** for the Recycled Waste Art Prize only, provided this piece meets the terms and conditions of the Recycled Waste Art Prize (see below for details).
- A third piece will not be considered unless it is for the Recycled Waste Art Prize.
- Entry for ILC students is **FREE**.

Recycled Waste Art Prize:

An environment and sustainability focussed art award open to all Primary aged students (Prep to Year 6) aiming to raise awareness of environmental issues by encouraging artmaking using recycled or recovered waste materials.

Please refrain from purchasing craft materials to use for this artwork. Rather use your creativity by using old beads, bottle tops, boxes, bottles and packaging material, etc.

Artworks must be the work of the child only and as such should not be welded, sawed or drilled beyond what would be reasonably and safely expected from a supervised primary aged child.

Artworks in this category can be 2D or 3D but should be no bigger than A3 in size, or 40cm in any direction. Judging will be based on artistic merit, creativity and use of recycled or repurposed items.

Artwork drop off:

- Students will need to drop their artwork to the Visual Art classroom (near the PS Tuckshop) between **8.00-8.30am** on one of the following days:
 - Monday 15 May
 - Tuesday 16 May
 - Wednesday 17 May
 - Thursday 18 May
 - Friday 19 May
- When students are dropping off their artwork to the Visual Art classroom on the above dates, they will be given a label to attach to the back of their artwork and they will need to write their name, class, artwork title and the selling price or '*Not For Sale*' if they are choosing not to sell their work.

Presentation of Primary School Art:

2D Student artwork (paintings, drawings, photography) should be **no larger** than A4 or A3 in size. Students are asked **NOT** to present their artwork in glass frames but should be mounted on either black or coloured card.

If work is presented on stretched canvas, a wire or cord must be securely attached to allow the artwork to be hung on a hook.

Artworks in Recycled Waste Art prize can be 2D or 3D but should be no bigger than A3 in size or 40cm in any direction. Work that is not sturdy enough for display, can cause harm to others (i.e. sharp edges) or is offensive may not be exhibited.

All work must be completely clean and dry when delivered.

Commission:

Immanuel Lutheran College will retain 10% of the indicated selling price for any works sold. Prize money and payment for items sold will be directly credited into a nominated bank account by 30 June.

2. PROCESS FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL ART SUBMISSIONS

- Secondary students are not required to fill out an online entry prior to submitting their artwork.
- Students can submit a maximum of **two (2) pieces** of art in any 2D or 3D medium (i.e. painting, photography, drawing, sculpture).
- Entry for ILC students is **FREE**.
- Students will need to drop their artwork to Mr Elliot or Mrs Taylor in the Visual Art classroom in the Eucalypt Building between Monday 15 and Friday 19 May.
- **No artwork or changes to artwork will be accepted after 12.00pm on Friday 19 May 2023.**
- When students are dropping off their artwork to the Visual Art classroom, they will be given a label to attach to the back of their artwork and they will need to write their name, home group and the selling price or 'Not For Sale' if they are choosing not to sell their work.

Student Film Entry – Secondary School students only:

Films must be submitted to Mr Hancock in the Secondary School by **Friday 19 May**.

The winner will be the Best Short Film as per the judging criteria, regardless of age. Films should be from 1-8 minutes long and must be submitted on USB. Films must be classified with an appropriate viewer rating (i.e. G, PG, M15+). The judge will assess each film against the criteria below:

Cinematography – Picture composition, shot style, use of light or surroundings

Technical – Camera use, sound quality, use of music/FX, editing, props and costume

Story – Engaging, comprehensible, suitability to age category and use of characters

Presentation of Secondary School Art:

2D Student artwork (paintings, drawings, photography) should be **no larger** than A3 in size. Students are asked **NOT** to present their artwork in glass frames but should be mounted on either black or coloured card.

If work is presented on stretched canvas, a wire or cord must be securely attached to allow the artwork to be hung on a hook. All work must be completely clean and dry when delivered.

Commission:

Immanuel Lutheran College will retain 10% of the indicated selling price for any works sold. Prize money and payment for items sold will be directly credited into a nominated bank account by 30 June.

3. COLLECTION OF ARTWORK FOR ILC STUDENTS

Unsold works will be returned to the student's classroom (Primary School) or the Visual Art classroom (Secondary School) on Monday 29 May. No works may be removed prior to the conclusion of the Festival.

4. COMPLIANCE

Submission of artwork is acknowledgement that provided information is correct, entry/entries are the student artist's original work and bona fide property, and the artist agrees to abide by the Conditions of Entry of the Immanuel Arts Festival.

5. ENTRY

All student artists must gain parent/guardian permission to enter the Festival. Student artists may submit up to two pieces in the Student Art category, plus one piece in the Primary School Recycled Waste Art Prize. Works in any medium are accepted if they are non-perishable and not offensive. The selection of works to be exhibited will be entirely at the discretion of the Festival Committee. All entries may not be selected for display.

6. PUBLICITY

Images of works submitted may be used for the purpose of advertising and marketing for current and future Festivals, including print and visual media.

7. LIABILITY

If a student is concerned about the security of their entry, they should contact the Festival Convenor. It is a condition of insurance that all artists register their work and expected value on the Entry Form; especially fragile works or works requiring special handling must be indicated to the convenor.

8. IDENTIFICATION/LABELLING

Students will be asked to label their artwork when they drop it off. This will include the student's name, home group/class group, title of work and selling price (hanging work) or bottom (standing work). Work which the student does not wish to sell must be clearly labelled '**Not for Sale**'.
